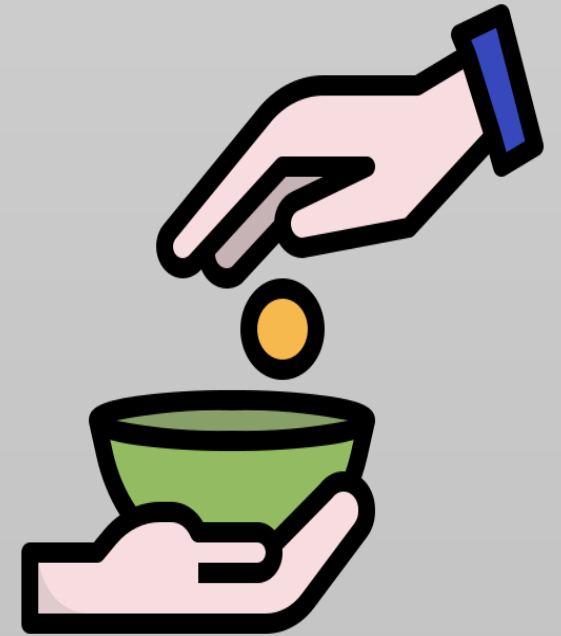

Poor Definition

- One of the definitions in Australia (as per Brotherhood of St. Laurence)
- Poverty is both:
 - the lack of access to an adequate material standard of living (in terms of food, shelter, clothing and health) resulting primarily, but not only, from inadequate income; and
 - the lack of opportunity to participate fully in society (for example through employment, education, recreation and social relationships).
- Definition of poverty can be different in every country and even within the same country definition may change as living standards change over the time.
- For e.g., at one time car may have been a luxury for society but now it's almost a necessity and someone who can't afford a basic car may come under the definition of poor in some societies.

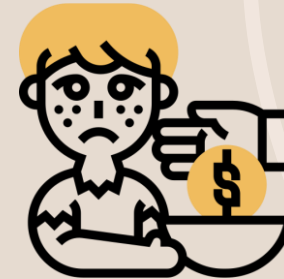
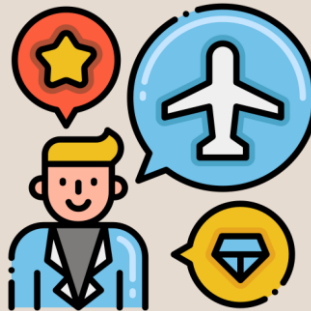
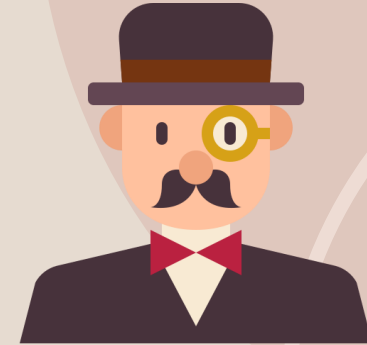

Rich Definition

- Rich means:
 - Having lot of possessions, especially material wealth
 - Having high quality life in material world
 - Able to afford things beyond necessities and doesn't have to worry about money for day-to-day survival
- Definition of rich can be different in every country and even within the same country definition may change as living standards change over the time.
- For e.g., at one time someone having a mobile was rich in India but now it can be bought by anyone.

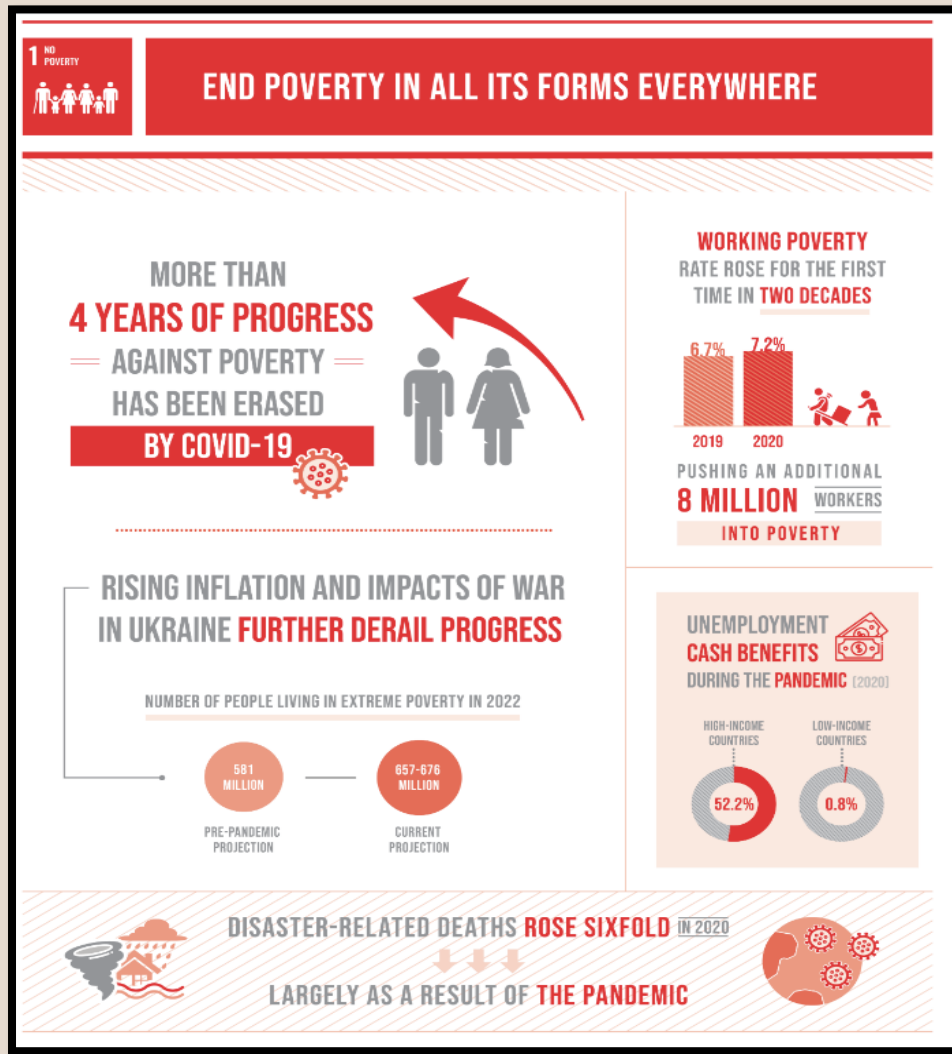

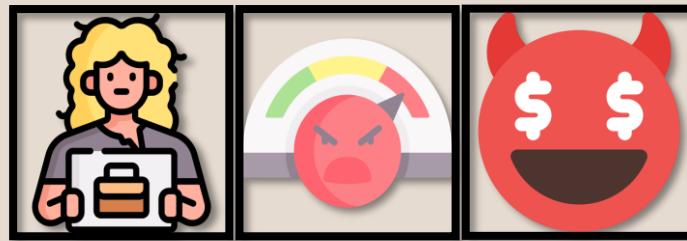

Says Kabeer Jee – The person who doesn't have good values / behavior / virtues of Waheguru Jee in life is spiritually poor.

John may be financially wealthy, but Gurbani states that a lack of good values makes him spiritually poor. His ability to easily obtain whatever he desires prevents him to appreciate the value of what he has. This makes him spiritually poor.

Summary

- Gurbani's focus is on **inner values** that drive my behavior and actions in the physical world.
- Gurbani advises that my wellbeing is not dependent upon being **physically rich** only. I need to be **spiritually rich** to live an overall balanced life.
- While doing all the physical activities, I should never lose the focus on earning **inner wealth**. When my focus is on earning **physical wealth** only and ignore the inner wealth, it impacts my behavior and well being in the long run.

Instead, he spends time with friends doing party and even gets involved in drugs and alcohol. Having bad habits impacts his health and that becomes reason for pain in his life. He has even bigger mental pain when he is informed that he has missed the business deal and now he doesn't know how to face his parents.

- Do you think mental pain is no less than physical pain? Can money help fix mental pain?

Distractions in my **mental world** make me lose focus from my target and in the end become reason of my **pain**.



Teachings of Gurbani or **Good Voice** should be the primary focus of my life. By adopting the Gurbani's message at depth of my heart gives me **peace forever**

John ignored the good voice, and his money and possessions made him develop ego. This created **distractions** in his life, and he couldn't focus on his goal that his parents gave him. Similarly, when we don't have **Gurbani** in our life, we get distracted and lose the focus from goal of this life. Distractions make me spiritually poor and impact my mental health which can't be fixed by any amount of physical money.

Summary

- Being **spiritually poor** makes me unfit to manage physical money and possessions.
- **Physical money** is **temporary** and there is always the fear to lose it and that becomes reason for my **stress**. If I am not contented, then no amount of money is enough for me and desire to earn more and more also leads to **stress** in my life
- Being **spiritually poor**, makes it hard for me to share my possessions with others. I start to **lose the faith** that Waheguru Jee will always take my care
- **Spiritually poor** also develops **ego** of physical possessions and even jealousy for the ones who have more possessions.
- Choice is always mine – I can feed my mental world with Gurbani and be **peaceful** or stay attracted in maya forever, be distracted from goal of my life and **impact my own wellbeing**.

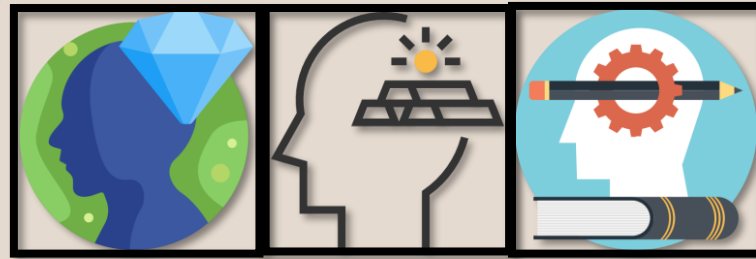

Listening to **Gurbani** with mental ears with the intent to adopt the **Gurbani** in life, makes us Spiritually rich. Wisdom of Gurbani is like **gems, diamonds** and **rubies** in physical world.

Gurmukh Singh may be poor in physical terms, but he is spiritually very rich by being contented and satisfied. This enables him to share with others and be thankful to Waheguru Jee.

Summary

- Gurbani's focus is on **inner values** that drive my behavior and actions in the physical world.
- Gurbani advise us to make sure we are **spiritually rich** by having **wealth of values**. Being **spiritually rich** makes it easier to share my resources – doesn't matter even if I have limited resources.
- **Inner wealth** also gives me the wisdom on how to best use the resources that Waheguru Jee has given us. It motivates me to learn from people who have more wisdom than me as opposed to being jealous of them.
- This **spiritual wealth** is within all of us; we can understand it with the help of Gurbani and adopting its teachings in life. This is the wealth that we are here to earn.

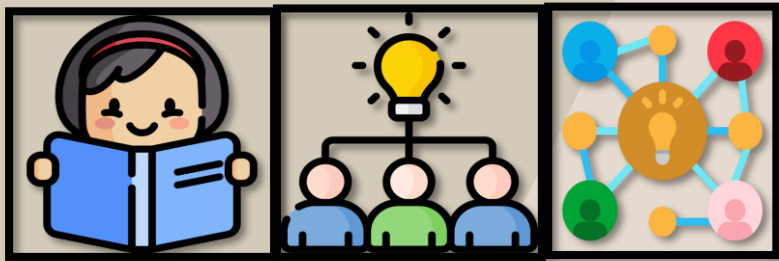

Wisdom (spiritual wealth) gained by **adopting** Gurbani helps me learn that this knowledge should be further **shared** with like minded people / sangat.



Unlike physical wealth, the wealth of knowledge doesn't decline by sharing. In fact, it keeps **increasing**, every time we share or learn from others.

Gurmukh Singh has spiritual wealth and it's increasing by sharing. John's knowledge is about physical wealth and lack of spiritual wealth makes him believe that sharing knowledge is not good. He thinks by sharing knowledge others may steal his ideas and become rich too.

Summary

- **Spiritual wealth** can be earned by adopting Gurbani in life. The virtues / good habits that I adopt by learning from **Gurbani is my real wealth**.
- **This wealth** keeps increasing as I share / learn from others. The more I spend (share), the **more it increases**. This not only **improves my wellbeing** but inspires me to share with others to help them improve their wellbeing too.
- **Spiritual wealth** can not be destroyed by fire, water or hackers. It stays with me forever and guides me to always make decisions in real life.
- As per Gurbani the individuals / society that focuses more on **spiritual wealth** is more at peace, happy and blissful.
- Physical poverty can be reduced in the world if there was more spiritual wealth with people who have physical wealth. The more they will be educated on benefits of sharing, more wealth of this world will be distributed

Summary


- World has challenges at both levels – Physical poverty and Spiritual Poverty
- More we have **spiritually rich people** in this world, more they will share the resources with others and less challenges of physical poverty
- There are enough resources in the world for everyone to survive and sustain. It's all about how humans share their resources with each other to take care of well being people around them
- Money is important for survival, but it can't be the only driver of life. **Spiritual wealth** is more important to manage the overall well being in our life.
- **Gurbani** and **Sikh History** is full of examples to support wellbeing of humanity.
